Subsequently, I can attest to his technical expertise to advise and refurbish those uniquely rare VTRs. I've had many discussions with him and consider Mr. Zin to be one of the true experts in the field of legacy video equipment. Additionally, as the Head of the Video Preservation Laboratory of the National Audio Video Conservation Center, Library of Congress, I have several videotape machines that are the product of Mr. Zin's experience.
